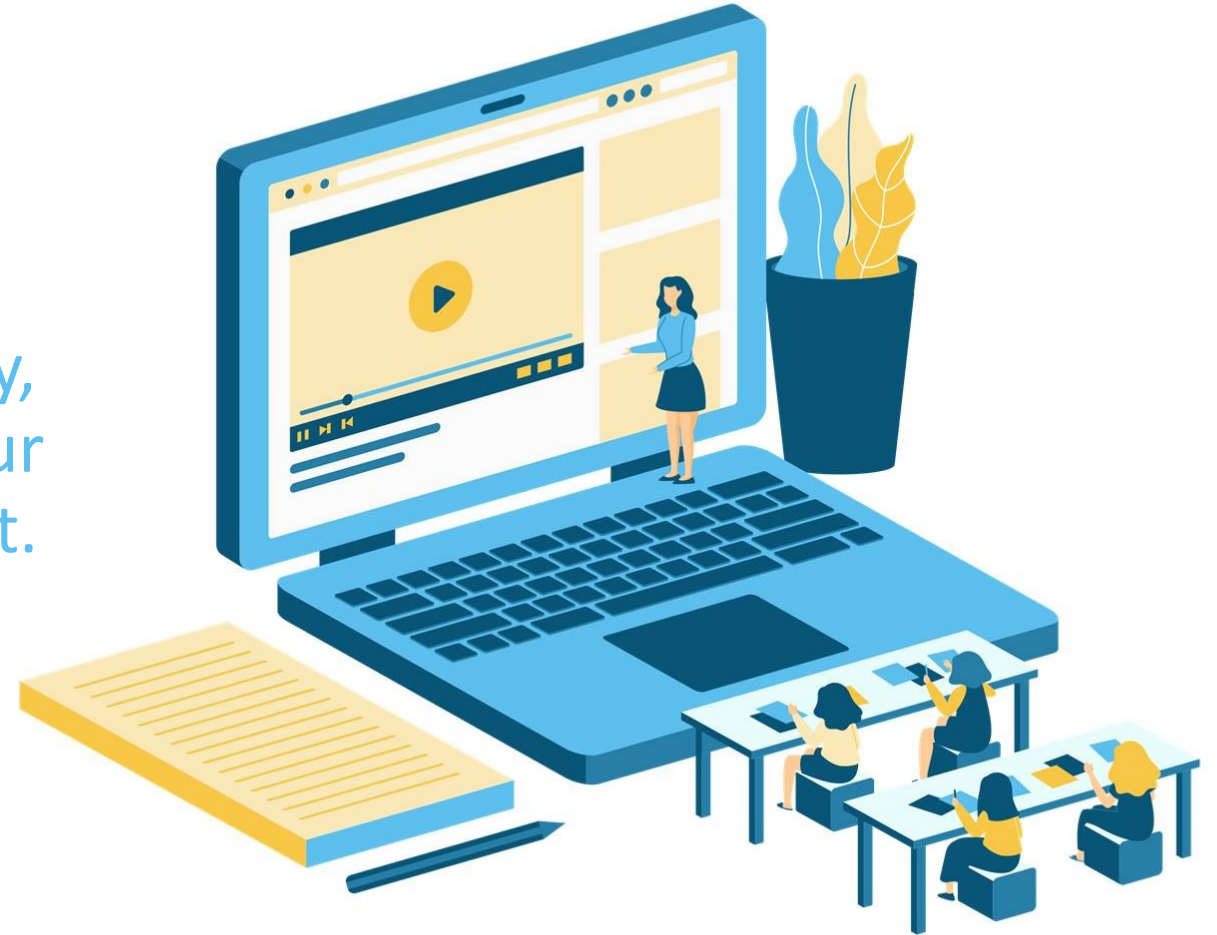

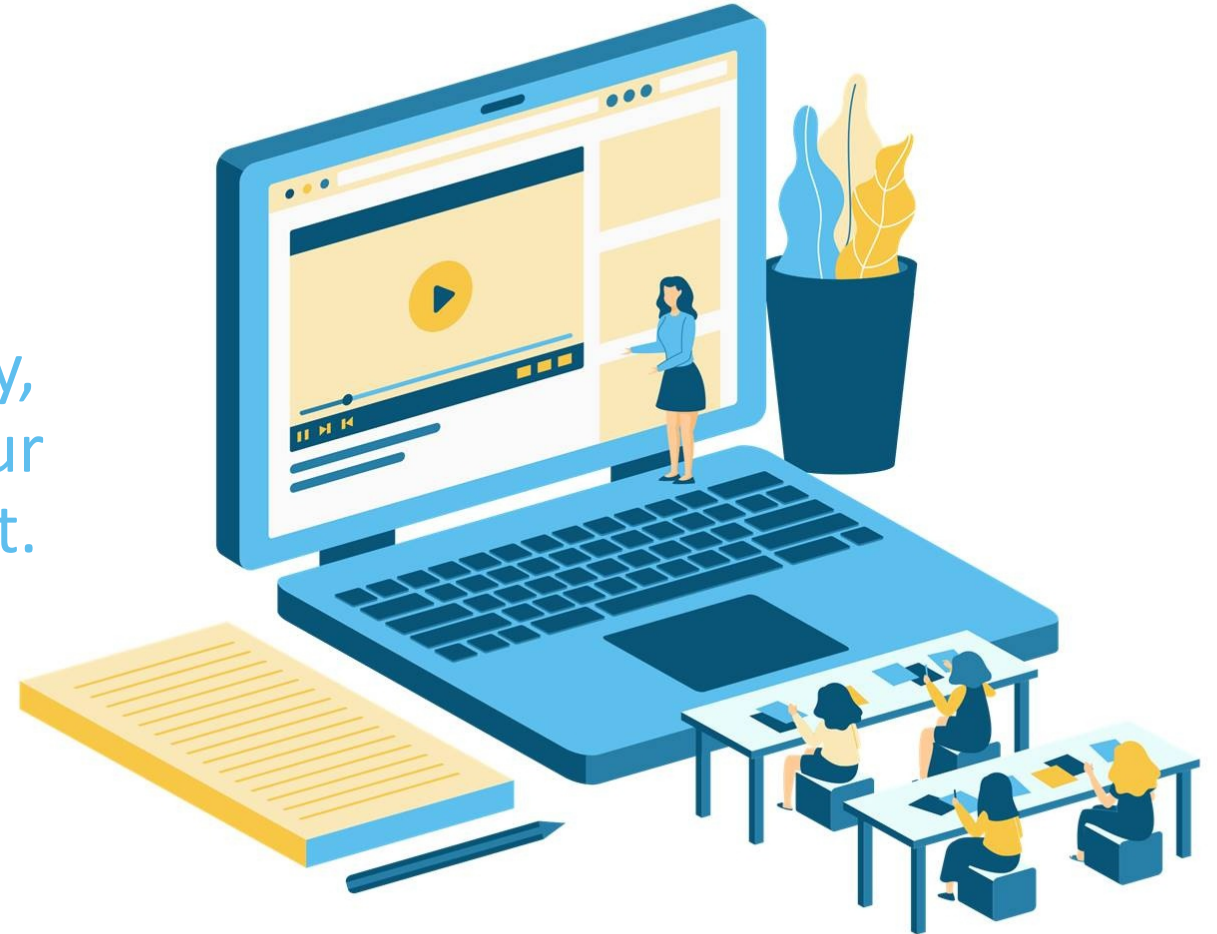
Majors vs. Minors

- **A minor is a secondary study focus that you can take some courses in.** These usually require less classes than a major. Minors are not always required.

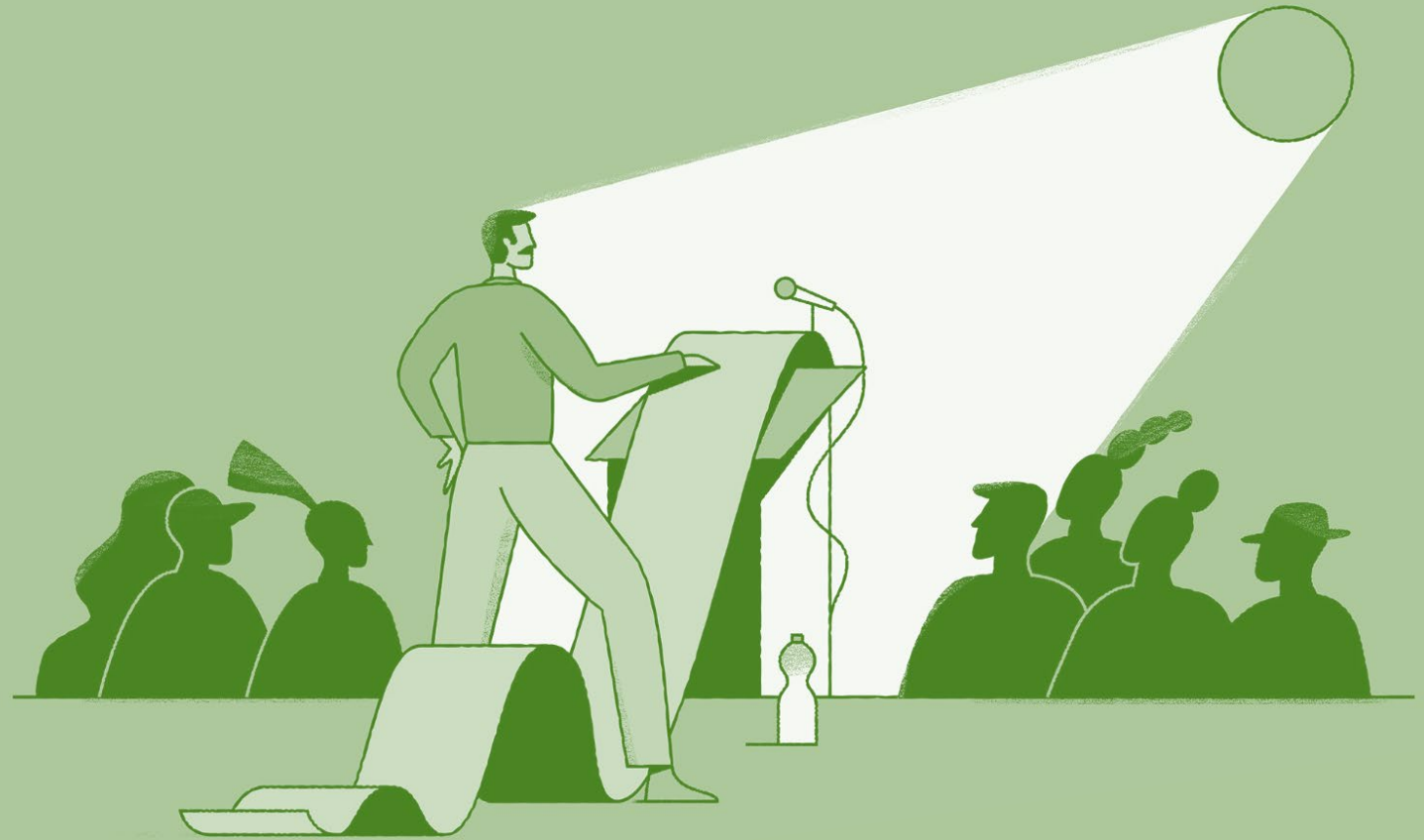

- **Keep in mind that certain degrees require you to commit early so that you can graduate on time.**

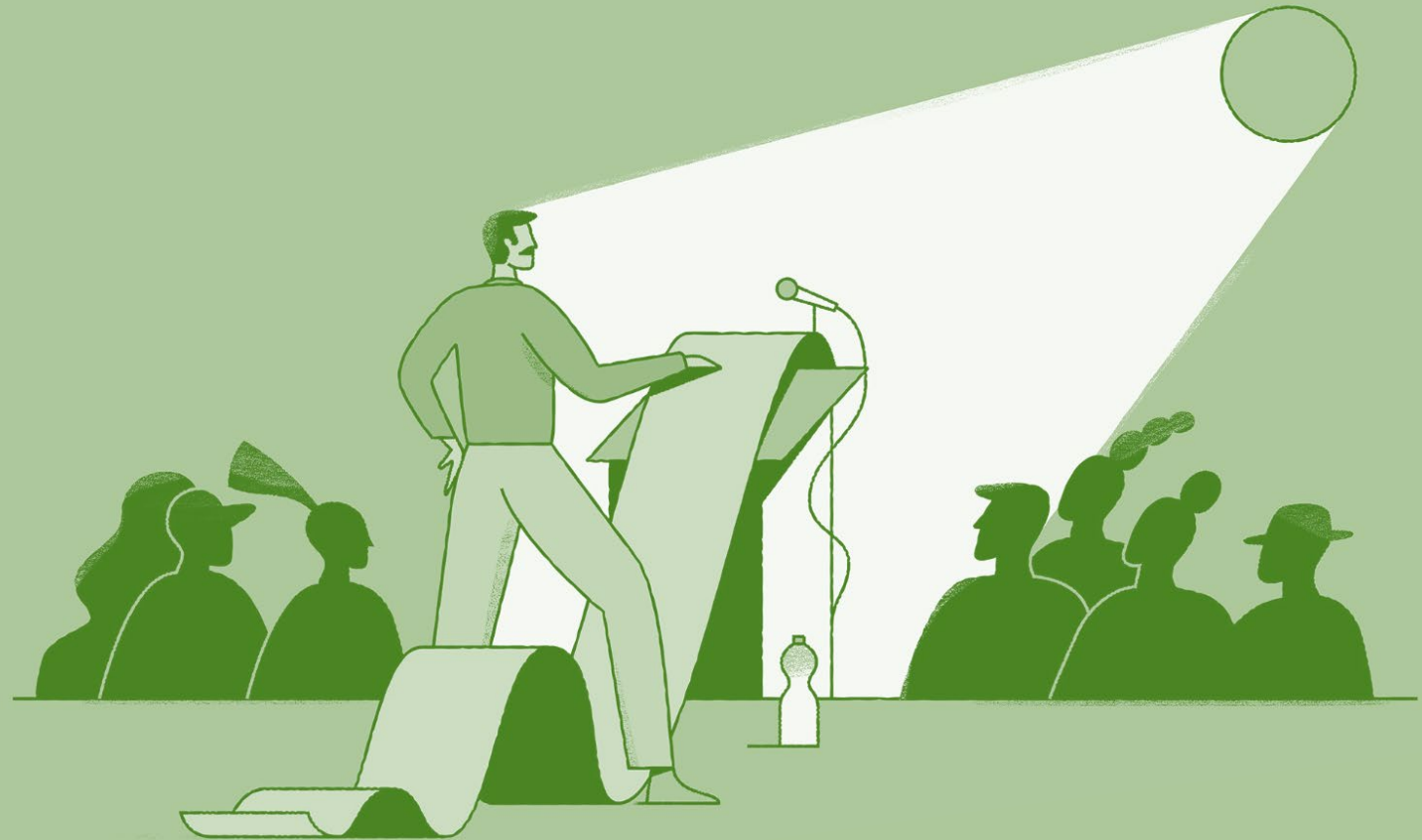
